


What is a Wetland?

They are an important part of our natural and cultural heritage.










Help us improve our air and water quality.







Gives us a place for fun activities such as swimming, kayaking and sailing.






For many economic reasons. Wetlands are estimated \$15 trillion in 1997 by MEA.
